PSA Rules for the Judging Process

- An entrant's images will not be presented to the judges consecutively.
- An entrant's four images will be distributed throughout four rounds of judging in that section.
- Distribution of images will be in the same round order as submitted by the entrant.
- At no stage will a judge be able to view all the entrant's images together.

Standard Conditions, Rules and Requirements

IMAGE AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: This exhibition is open to anyone; however, an entry may berejected when the Sponsor or the Exhibition Organizers, in their reasonable discretion, believes the entry does notconform to exhibition rules and these ES-COE. Membership in any photographic organization is not required. Entries will not be accepted from any entrant who is on the **PSA Penalties List for Ethics Violation.** Entry fees are not refundable in these circumstances.

PSA Star Ratings: To receive proper Star ratings credit from PSA, entrants must provide their names and countryexactly the same way in each exhibition. Aliases are not permitted. Please contact PSA in the event ofname changes or relocating to another country. Using one's name differently in different exhibition exposes theentrant to the risk that many of their acceptances may not be recognized by PSA Star Ratings.

Image creation and ownership

In all sections of the exhibition, images must originate as photographs made by the entrant. They may not incorporate identifiable images produced by anyone else (for example: clip art, replacement skies, or stock images). *Images created in whole or in part by image creation software (frequently called 'Al' images) are not allowed*. Editing or alteration of images is permitted within the limits specified in the relevant section definitions that are available here https://psa-photo.org/page/division-definitions

Any person submitting or attempting to submit a totally AI generated image that does not begin with a light capture from the maker, from any Photographic Society of America exhibition, social media, event, or publication, other than for editorial purposes, shall be prohibited from PSA for a period of from 3 years to life.

Reproduction: The entrant permits the sponsors to reproduce all or part of the entered material free of chargefor publication and/or display in media related to the exhibition. This may include low resolution posting on awebsite. The Photographic Society of America (PSA) may request specific permission from entrants toreproduce entered images in its educational materials. The terms of that permission will be mutually agreedbetween the entrant and PSA except in the circumstances where the entered image is found to breach the PSAEthics Policy. In those circumstances the image may be reproduced by PSA, without the entrant's further permission, for educational purposes to illustrate serious exhibition rule violations. For those reproductions, the entrant's name will be withheld. Entries will not be accepted from entrants who indicate that their images may not. be reproduced in materials related to the exhibition. The exhibition assumes no liability of any misuse of copyright.

Re-use of accepted images: Any image that has been accepted in this exhibition, past or present, may not beentered again in the same Division Star Ratings Class in any future instances of this exhibition. It may, of course, be entered in any other PSA recognized exhibitions but **must always** have the same title. Re-titling in anotherlanguage is not allowed.

Entry: An Entry consists of, up to and including, four (4) images entered by a single entrant into the same Section. An entrant may only enter a specific Section once. Entrants may not enter identical or similar imagesinto the same section or different sections of the same exhibition. Similar is defined as almost identical in subject, composition, props, lighting or technique so that a reasonable person viewing the entries together would decide entrant has duplicated the previous image except for minor changes.

Titles: Each image must have a unique title that relates to the content of the image. That unique title must beused for entry of that image or of an identical Image into any and all PSA-Recognized exhibitions. Titles must be35 characters or fewer. No titles may be visible to the judges, and nothing in the image may identify the entrant. Titles may not include file extensions such as .jpg or .jpeg (or any other camera capture filenames such as IMG471). Titles may not consist of personal identifiers possibly augmented by a number; or include words such as "untitled" or "no title". Titles may not consist solely of numbers unless those numbers are prominently contained within the image, such as a contestant number in a race.

Color and Monochrome: Color and Monochrome images from the same capture that share substantial pictorialcontent in common will be considered the same image and must be given the same title.

Judging Method: "This Exhibition will be judged on-line remotely. The judges will be using color calibrated equipment that will be capable of displaying images at 100% of the image resolution. The Target range will be under 30%."

Entry Details:

- Photos must be submitted in JPEG file format following instructions https://creativeartsalon.in
- Maximum Horizontal length is 1920 pix. Maximum Vertical length is 1080 pix. In 300 dpi. Compression 7-12, maximum 2Mb.
- Exhibition software shall not resize image and that oversized image shall be rejected by the system.

Data Protection: By entering this exhibition, you are explicitly consenting to the personal details you havesupplied, including physical addresses, email addresses, being held, processed and used by the exhibitionorganizers for purposes associated with this exhibition. You also explicitly consent to such information being sentto organizations that have accorded official recognition, patronage or accreditation to this exhibition. Youacknowledge, agree and accept that by entering this exhibition, your participation status which includes your firstand last name, name of the country used during registration at the exhibition, number of sections entered and number of photos entered in those sections will be made public in a published status list and that the results of your entry shall be made public in exhibition gallery, exhibition catalog. You also agree and accept the policyregarding noncompliance to the rules of PSA.

Subject Matter and Section Definitions

The following pages define what is expected and acceptable for each of the sections. **Please read carefully**.

Statement on Subject Matter - applicable to all sections

The fundamental rule that must be observed at all times and **applies to all sections** offered in exhibitions with PSA recognition is that **the welfare of living creatures is more important than any photograph**. This means that practices such as baiting of subjects with a living creature and removal of birds from nests, for the purpose of obtaining a photograph, are highly unethical, and such photographs are not allowed in any exhibition with PSA recognition. Under no circumstances may a living creature be placed in a situation where it will be killed, injuredor stressed for the purpose of obtaining a photograph. Images that show live creatures being fed to captive animals, birds or reptiles are not permitted under any circumstances.

There are also concerns about the use of aerial photography, drones, helicopters, low flying aircraft. These shouldnot cause any interference with other individuals or animals which causes a disturbance in their normal activity ordisrupt the way any individuals or animals interact with their environment. Entrants in PSA recognized exhibitions should comply with all relevant laws and regulations, associated with aerial photography, in the country in which the image was taken.

Entry into PSA recognized exhibitions is conditional on accepting these policies. The content of images mustcomply with the General Conditions and with the Division and Section definitions listed in these conditions. Images that - in the sole opinion of the judges- do not comply, will be disqualified so the entrant may be aware ofthe problem when considering entry into other exhibitions with PSA recognition.

PSA Monochrome Definition

An image is considered to be Monochrome only if it gives the impression of having no color (i.e., contains onlyshades of grey which can include pure black and pure white) OR it gives the impression of being a greyscaleimage that has been toned in one color across the entire image. (For example, by Sepia, red, gold, etc.) Agreyscale or multi-colored image modified or giving the impression of having been modified by partial toning, multi-toning or by the inclusion of spot coloring does not meet the definition of monochrome and shall be. classified as a Color Work.

Grayscale Monochrome images may be entered for Nature, Photojournalism and Photo Travel but toned images are not permitted for these sections.

Monochrome images may not be entered in Pictorial Prints or PID Color Sections.

Editing Guidelines for Nature, Photojournalism and Photo Travel

These 3 sections require images to be truthful records, so there are limits on the amount of manipulationallowed. *Exhibitors are reminded that the PSA Statement on Subject Matter above applies to all sections and totheEditing Guidelines for Nature, Photojournalism and Photo Travel.*

Editing Guidelines

Processing or editing must be limited to making the image look as close to the original scene as possible, exceptthat conversion to grayscale monochrome is allowed.

Allowed editing techniques:

- Cropping, straightening and perspective correction.
- Removal or correction of elements added by the camera or lens, such as dust spots, noise, chromaticaberration and lens distortion.
- Global and selective adjustments such as brightness, hue, saturation and contrast to restore the appearance of the original scene.
- Complete conversion of color images to grayscale monochrome.
- Blending of multiple images of the same subject and combining them in camera or with software (exposureblending or focus stacking);
- Image stitching combining multiple images with overlapping fields of view that are taken consecutively(panoramas);

Additional Allowed Photojournalism editing technique:

• A number of images (typically 2-4), each with a small white border, may be combined into a single imagethat depicts a progression of events or related activity.

Editing techniques that are not allowed:

- Removing, adding to, moving or changing any part of an image, except for cropping and straightening.
- Adding a vignette during processing.
- Blurring parts of the image during processing to hide elements in the original scene.
- Darkening parts of the image during processing to hide elements in the original scene.
- All conversions other than to complete grayscale monochrome.
- Conversion of parts of an image to monochrome, or partial toning, desaturation or oversaturation of color

PSA/FIAP Nature Definition (ND)

ND Content Guidelines

- Nature photography records all branches of natural history except anthropology and archaeology. This includes all aspects of the physical world, both animate and inanimate, that have not been made ormodified by humans.
- Nature images must convey the truth of the scene that was photographed. A well-informed
 person shouldbe able to identify the subject of the image and be satisfied that it has been
 presented honestly and that nounethical practices have been used to control the subject or
 capture the image. Images that directly orindirectly show any human activity that threatens
 the life or welfare of a living organism are not allowed.
- The most important part of a Nature image is the nature story it tells. High technical standards are expected and the image must look natural.

- Objects created by humans, and evidence of human activity, are allowed in Nature images only when they are a necessary part of the Nature story.
- Photographs of human-created hybrid plants, cultivated plants, feral animals, domesticated animals, human-created hybrid animals and mounted or preserved zoological specimens are not allowed.
- Images taken with subjects under controlled conditions, such as zoos, are allowed.
- Controlling live subjects by chilling, anesthetic or any other method of restricting natural movement for thepurpose of a photograph is not allowed.

Photojournalism Definition (PJ)

Photojournalism entries are:

- images with informative content and emotional impact,
- reflecting the human presence in our world.
- The journalistic (story-telling) value of the image should receive priority over pictorial quality.
- Images that misrepresent the truth, such as those from events or activities arranged specifically for photography, or of subjects directed or hired for photography, are not eligible.

Photo Travel (PT)

A Photo Travel image is a portrayal of the real world we live in, as it is found naturally. There are no geographic limitations.

PT Content Guidelines

- 1. If the image is predominantly or exclusively a land-, sea- or cityscape, these "scapes" must include characteristic, distinctive and recognizable physical features, although it is not necessary that the imageidentify the exact location;
- 2. Images that predominantly or exclusively depict people and their activities must illustrate a distinctiveculture of a country, region, or continent;
- 3. Images that predominately or exclusively depict animal populations are allowed, if the animals are in theirnative environment and are characteristic of that country, region, or continent;
- 4. Portraits or other close-ups of people or objects, in addition to meeting the above paragraphs as applicable, must include elements depicting some of the surrounding environment to make it obvious that the imagewas not taken in a studio setting;
- 5. Images from events or activities arranged for photography, or of subjects directed or hired for photography, are **NOT allowed.**
- 6. Time exposures are allowed, if they do not dominate the image as a special effect (star trails, for example, are a dominating effect).
- 7. Highly distorted images such as those produced by fish eye lenses are **NOT allowed.**

Non-compliance

If, in the discretion of the exhibition organizer or the judges, an entrant has submitted that may fail to complywith these Conditions of Entry, they are allowed to request unedited or raw files of the submitted image. Forcomposite images all files are required.

Exhibition organizers may verify that:

- 1. the images are the original work of the entrant;
- 2. the images comply with the rules and definitions as set out in these ES-COE.

Such entries may be referred to PSA for further investigation of possible ethics violations.

PSA retains the right to investigate all complaints, impose penalties if deemed necessary, void the acceptances of any image found to violate the PSA rules, include the entrant's name on the list of sanctions provided to Exhibitions, and share such investigations with FIAP. Entrants automatically agree to these terms by the act of entering the Exhibition and agree to cooperate with any investigation.

If another party is processing and/or submitting images on the entrant's behalf, the entrant will still be heldresponsible for adhering to the entry rules **and will be subject to penalties for any violations** to theseConditions of Entry or to PSA's Statement of Ethics.

When entrants fill in the Entry Form to submit an entry they will see the following feature to affirm they haveread these Conditions of Entry.
